Franschhoek

The Origin

A long time ago in our corner of the world, there was a refuge for herds of elephants, that migrated to this valley to give birth to their young. With the prominence of these magical creatures the name 'Oliphantshoek" (Elephant's Corner) was bestowed on the valley. With the revocation of the Edict of Nantes in France in 1685, the valley also became the refuge to French Huguenots who fled France and arrived in the Cape of Good Hope. Many were given land in our valley and soon after

Oliphantshoek became known as Franschhoek. (French Corner). The French brought with them their knowledge of the vine and 325 years later it is evident in the excellent quality wines produced on African soil.

Origin of Wine

The oldest known possible evidence for the use of grapes as part of a wine recipe originates in China 9000 years ago.

Residues on pottery from Jiahu are recognized as a fermented beverage made with rice, honey, and fruit. Fruit presence was identified by the presence of tartrate; however, the species could not be identified between grape, hawthorn, or cherry. Two thousand years later, the seeds (or I suppose pips) of what became the European wine-making tradition began in western Asia. In Europe, wild grape pips have been found at Franchthi Cave, Greece 12,000 years ago, and Balma de l'Abeurador,

France 10,000 years ago. Excavations at a site in Greece called Dikili Tash have revealed grape pips and empty skins, direct dated to between 4400-4000 BC, the earliest example to date in the Aegean. A wine production installation dated to 4000 BC was discovered at Areni 1 in Armenia. It presented a platform for crushing grapes, a method of moving the crushed liquid into

storage jars and potential evidence for the fermentation of red wine. In 6000 BC wine making became popular in countries like Egypt, Rome and Greece. Through the archaeological evidences that had been found, experts determined that the most classical wine production took place in Georgia and Iran as early as 6000BC to 5000BC.

Wine consumption reached international appeal from the 15th century to today.
